As National Merit Semi-Finalists, they join an elite group selected from over 1.2 million entrants representing some 20,000 schools across the United States. Semi-finalists are the highest scoring entrants on the PSAT test, representing less than 1% of high school seniors nationwide. Each of them has the opportunity to continue in the process, competing for scholarship awards of up to \$2500. Annually, 90% of all semifinalists become finalists, which is perhaps the most prestigious recognition given to high school students on a national level! For the past two years, all of Naperville North's National Merit Semi-Finalists earned Finalist status. Congratulations again to our semi-finalists! We are all very proud of your accomplishments!

I would like to encourage each of you to take advantage of the opportunity to meet with your student's teachers during **Parent/Teacher Conferences on Thursday evening, October 7th and/or Friday morning, October 8th**. Parent/Teacher Conferences provide a wonderful opportunity for you to meet individually with your student's teachers and share valuable information about your student's progress. A packet of information is provided in this *Huskie Howler* for your use. Please take time to review these materials carefully. If you need extra copies, your student can pick them up in the Main Office, the Pupil Personnel Services Office or on our website at www.ncusd203.org/north/.

DEBIT CARD NEWS FROM SODEXHO

The debit system is an easy and convenient way to pay for meals and snacks at school. A student merely makes a deposit to a personal account then each time a purchase is made in the cafeteria, the student's ID is swiped and the amount of the sale is automatically deducted from the account balance.

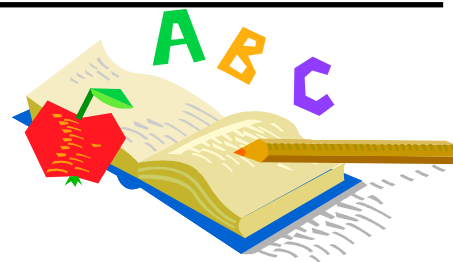
National Honor Society

SENIOR PARENT COLLEGE NIGHT

Parents and guardians of senior students will want to be in attendance **Wednesday, Sept 22 at 7:00 p.m.** for the college planning session presented by Mrs. Laura Iverson, counselor at NNHS. The presentation will answer all of your questions about procedures for submitting college applications with transcripts and other supporting documents, as well as "what to do when." Although a number of students may already be working on their applications, attendance at this program is strongly encouraged before completing this important task.

JUNIOR PARENT COLLEGE PLANNING NIGHT

Parents/guardians and their junior students are encouraged to be in attendance **Wednesday, Sept. 29 at 7:00 p.m.** Mr. Jim Hendrick, counselor at North, will present an up-to-date overview of the college search process. Ms. Kathy Liace, Reading Consultant in the Literacy Center, will provide information about preparing for ACT and SAT college entrance exams. Handouts will be available.

PSAT-NMSQT

The PSAT-NMSQT will be given **Saturday morning, Oct. 16.** This is a practice for the SAT college admissions exam and is the qualifying test for the National Merit Scholarship Program. It is taken primarily by juniors. Students should listen for an announcement during the week of Sept. 20 that will give instructions and deadline for registration in the Guidance Office. PSAT-NMSQT is given only once per year.

PLAN ASSESSMENT FOR SOPHOMORES

All sophomores will take the PLAN Assessment on Friday, September 24. This is a practice for the ACT college admissions exam and includes a career interest inventory. Results for each student will include career suggestions and an estimate of future ACT score. It is a valuable planning tool for students and their parents/guardians. Students should come to school well-rested and prepared to put forth their best effort to ensure the validity of the results.

COLLEGE OF DUPAGE COLLEGE FAIR

College of DuPage will host its College Fair **Thursday, Oct. 21, from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m.** Many colleges and universities will be represented. The fair is open to all district high school students and their families. Build your list of college choices, pick up information and applications, and ask representatives your specific questions. PARENT AND STUDENT PRE-REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

DUE THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 30 or FRIDAY, OCTOBER 1

To assure you an opportunity to confer with teachers, counselors or administrators of your choice, please observe the following pre-registration procedures:

1. All the information requested should be entered under the column designated **"Requested Conference Time"** on your **PARENT FORM** enclosed.
2. Select the desired time you wish to be scheduled for each conference. Allow yourself sufficient time to go from one conference to the next. If you need more than five minutes, sign up for two consecutive conferences.
3. Enter the name of the teacher and subject taught, counselor, or administrator on the line next to the conference time you have selected. If you wish to schedule a conference time with your student's counselor, your student will need to take the form to the Guidance Office. If you wish to schedule a conference with an administrator, your student will need to take the form to the Main Office, Principal's Office or Dean's Office depending on the location of the administrator you wish to see.
4. After you have completed your portion of the **PARENT FORM**, your student must take the form to each teacher, counselor, or administrator on THURSDAY, September 30, or FRIDAY, October 1, 2004. The student will present the form to each person you want to see. Every attempt will be made to schedule conference times as close to your request as possible.
5. After the appointments have been made, your student should bring the PARENT FORM home to you so that you can bring it along to the conference. This is the schedule that you will follow for the conferences.
6. If you are unable to complete the pre-registration process, you may still come to school during the conference sessions; however, be aware that the pre-registered conferences have priority. Each teacher will have a scheduled conference list posted outside the classroom door for you to schedule additional conferences.
